#Helloyellow was a huge success, our students have made us very proud!



We encourage all parents and carers to apply irrespective of their income. This is because if your circumstances change, you'll automatically be enrolled and your child can start receiving free school meals right away. But it's not just about the free meals. If your child is eligible for Free School Meals and you register them for this, we will receive extra funding called 'Pupil Premium'. This additional funding is used to improve educational provisions and resources across school.
