

Relationships, Sex and Health Education (RSHE)

Dear Parent/Carer

The teaching of Relationships, Sex and Health Education (RSHE) became compulsory in the academic year 2019-20. Start dates have been postponed a number of times in response to the on-going disruption caused by the Coronavirus pandemic, but Heworth began teaching this curriculum in the academic year 2020 -21 and all parents/carers were consulted on the new PSHE curriculum. Once again this year we will be teaching the new statutory RSHE (relationships, sex and health education) elements within our PSHE (Personal, social, health education) curriculum and we are again consulting with all parents/carers as we begin teaching these elements.

This component of the curriculum has been introduced by the government as:

"Today's children and young people are growing up in an increasingly complex world and living their lives seamlessly on and offline. This presents many positive and exciting opportunities, but also challenges and risks. In this environment, children and young people need to know how to be safe and healthy, and how to manage their academic, personal and social lives in a positive way." (DfE Statutory guidance)

Aspects of this curriculum entitlement are already taught within National Curriculum subjects such as Science, English, ICT and PE, but the vast majority will be taught in Social and Cultural Studies.

Parents and Carers have the right to withdraw their child from the Sex Education component of the RSHE curriculum, but all other aspects remain compulsory. Sex education does, however, remain compulsory in the National Curriculum and is taught primarily in science and covers topics such as human growth and reproduction.
