CURRICULUM

The rich education we offer ensures that every student receives their national curriculum entitlement which is complimented by an extensive range of extracurricular activities through our extensive Personal Development offer. The Personal Development curriculum is designed to further enrich the lives of our students and prepare them for success in the classroom and beyond.

CO-CURRICULUM

We offer a variety of an extensive range of co-curriculum activities open to all students, which includes PE department's programme of team events and coaching, daily breakfast clubs, and opportunities to participate in Expressive and Performing arts events.

The purpose of the co-curricular programme is to provide enrichment activities for all our students outside the main curriculum of the school, creating the opportunity for them to maximise their post-school opportunities.

At Heworth, our co-curricular programme enables students to broaden their horizons, raise their aspirations, and develop their character and resilience. It gives all students the chance to work and co-operate with others in a relaxed and fun environment, developing their social skills and enhancing their sense of wellbeing.

For Years 7 and 8, we have a wide range of clubs and activities that your child can choose from, including; careers club, languages club, baking club, theatre production club, and games club.

For Year 9 the main focus is the Duke of Edinburgh (D of E) award scheme. The scheme is a life-changing experience, an opportunity to discover new interests and talents, and develop essential skills for life and work. It is a recognised mark of achievement; respected by employers.



SEND, THE PITSTOP, & MENTAL HEALTH SUPPORT

The overview of SEND is maintained by the SENCO and the SEND team in collaboration with the Head of Year, advisor, teaching staff, student and parents.

Students with learning difficulties may be supported in several ways either by, in-class support, smaller teaching groups, or one-to-one support via withdrawal from lessons. Students who have low levels of literacy and numeracy work with the SEND team to support gaps in knowledge.

The PITSTOP is also available to students at Heworth Grange, which is found in the Student Support area of school. The Pitstop recognises and caters to the individual needs students may have, for example being anxious or experiencing difficulties in certain curriculum areas. The staff in PITSTOP help our young people and devise a plan to support them back into the mainstream curriculum.

Heworth Grange School is a 'family away from home', where students are made to feel valued, safe, and secure. Therefore, we are committed to supporting all students with their mental health and wellbeing.

In light of the Coronavirus pandemic, it's clear that now, more than ever, schools need to offer support and resources to students, staff, and parents who may be struggling mentally after the strains and stresses of the last year. Therefore, we have a range of resources available to help support our community with their mental health. Students who are are severely struggling can also reach out to our Metal Health Councellors, Mrs Mitchell, and Dr Blanchard, directly at school, so we can support them further.



ENGLISH AS AN ADDITIONAL LANGUAGE

Students with EAL have the right to a safe and stimulating learning environment in which their languages and cultures are valued. They are entitled to the same educational opportunities as their monolingual peers with access to a broad, balanced and relevant curriculum.

EAL learners have distinct and different needs affected by, among other things, their previous experience of schooling and literacy in their first language, the age at which they enter the UK educational system and their home and communities' expectations of education, language and learning. Some students have suffered emotional and psychological trauma as a result of loss and displacement in their countries of origin.

Students' general knowledge and language knowledge must be considered when placing them in teaching groups. EAL learners make the best progress within a whole school context, where pupils are educated with their peers.

Bilingualism is viewed as a positive and life-enriching asset that will support the student when moving into Post-16 opportunities.

The school structure, pastoral care and overall ethos help EAL students integrate into the school whilst valuing diversity.

Although learners may acquire fluency in conversational English quite quickly, it can take much longer to acquire the level of proficiency in academic English which is required to succeed within the school curriculum.

EAL Vision

As a school, we recognise that EAL learners and their families make a valuable contribution to both the school and the community.

English is best learnt through the curriculum and students should be encouraged to play as full a part as possible in classroom activities from the beginning. Resources and support should be made available where necessary for EAL students to access the curriculum.

Learning an additional language may present challenges to the curriculum but this does not signify that the student has a special education need. Students with English as an additional language may also have a special educational need and these need to be assessed accordingly.







TRANSITION

We know starting a new school can be an exciting and challenging time for students.

We have a well-established transition programme whereby all students in our partner primary schools benefit from learning experiences with us. As well as specialist lessons, students in our partner primary schools also receive teaching visits from Heworth Staff in their own schools.

Our wide and varied programme introduces primary schools to Heworth and creates a safe and successful transition process for those students who join us for their secondary education.

Our Primary Liaison Transition Team aim is for all students to experience a successful transition from Key Stage 2 to Key Stage 3.

All our teachers share this aim but our Liaison Team, in particular, work in collaboration with primary staff and parents to ensure we achieve this. We pride ourselves in the care shown to students and this care begins even before a child joins us. This means we get to know them (and their parents and carers) before they become part of the Heworth family, so, when they do join us they feel happy, confident, and ready to learn. Parents and carers can be assured of a close working relationship between home and school.

FACILITIES

Heworth Grange School boasts an extensive range of state of the art, on site facilities that all our students can access and take advantage of. All of our classrooms are fully equipped, we have nine fully modernised science labs, two Design and Technology workshops, as well as a school library – fully stocked with a range of books for all abilities.

Heworth Grange is now a Microsoft Showcase School, with four fully modern computer suites, an Apple MAC editing studio, and fully furnished photography studio.

We have two large sports halls, a newly equipped gym, as well as impressive outdoor facilities; including two large sports fields and a jumping pit.

We have also invested in our arts facilities, with our feature drama studio – The 'Phil Welch Theatre', being complete with professional grade lighting and sounding, and hosting several student shows a year. We also have a dance studio, two fully stocked music rooms, a music technology Apple Mac suite, and two specialist art studios.

Whatever your child's passion, we have the facilities to inspire and enable them to grow.

PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT AND CAREERS

At Heworth Grange our students are at the heart of everything we do, and we want them to achieve success while with us, but also after they leave us. This is why we have a fully integrated personal development programme for every one of our students, to help raise their aspirations, support them, and provide them with a greater range of skills.

The Personal Development (PD) programme is built around a clear structure all staff contribute to. The structure is based on the '7 pillars of PD':


