Raising of the Participation Age

All young people in England are required to remain in education or training up to the age of 18.

Young people have a choice about how they do this. It could be through:

- Full time study in school, at college or with a training provider
- Full time work or volunteering (20 hrs+) alongside part time regulated training/education (one day per week)
- An apprenticeship or traineeship

What are those options?

Education (September start date only)

School 6th Form – Students typically study either A' levels or BTECs (GCSE 4+ needed)

College – Students can study either A' levels or vocational courses (T' levels & BTECs).

Examples of college courses (see college websites for full list):

- Children, Health & Social Care
- Digital Technology (Games / Cyber Security / Software)
- Emergency Services / Military Preparation
- Hair & Beauty
- Hospitality & Catering
- Sports & Outdoor Adventure
- Foundation Learning: for students with special educational needs / ECHP

Colleges offer:

- Open Evenings once a month (see websites for details)
- Taster Days where you can 'sample' a course before enrolling (see websites for details)

Training (Ongoing recruitment throughout the year)

 Apprenticeship – Employer-based learning (train in a specific career) www.findapprenticeship.service.gov.uk

Apprenticeships often ask for specific qualifications before applying. If you do not have these qualifications you can look at a:

- Traineeship These help you get work ready for your ideal job/apprenticeship by providing work experience with an employer, working on further English, maths and ICT qualifications all with the help and support of staff. They can last up to 6 months.
- Study Programme This is a similar course to a traineeship but can last from 6-12 months giving you more time to become work ready and may give you the opportunity to work towards job related qualifications as well GCSE/ Functional Skills in English & maths

Benefits

Child Benefit

If you start a full-time college course, traineeship or study programme (more than 12 hours per week), your parents/carers may be able to claim Child Benefit. You may also be able to claim a bursary or get help with travel costs through your educational provider.

Universal Credit

18 year olds and some under 18s living independently from their parents/cares and for other special reasons can be entitled to make a claim for Universal Credit (benefit). If successful, you will be allocated a Work Coach who's job it is to help you look for work. Make a claim for Universal Credit online by using the following link www.gov.uk/apply-universal-credit
