Dear KS3 parent/carer,

We have secured some additional funding that we would like to offer to your KS3 child to receive some online tutoring as part of a **virtual summer school** offer over one week of the summer holidays, in partnership with MyTutor.

MyTutor's online tuition platform is easily accessible and is staffed by bright and experienced university tutors; this helps to raise children's grades and confidence. We know that regular attendance with MyTutor lessons can help students make excellent progress after just 10 hours of tutoring. We would love for your child to have the opportunity to make this progress over the summer holiday.

The tutoring will be delivered as part of the National Tutoring Programme and is entirely online. This means that the tutoring sessions can be accessed from home using a laptop or tablet. The summer school sessions will happen in 3:1 groups so that your child can have more personalised input with two of their peers ahead of starting Year 11. We are confident that this input will help them feel more confident as they go into their final academic year at Heworth Grange.

The subject sessions will be for 2 hours per day for during one week of the summer holidays, equating to 10 hours overall. Sessions will be delivered in English, mathematics, and science. There are a number of weeks available so that this can work around your existing plans.
